People: Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God!

Reader: Risen from the tomb, You met the myrrh-bearing women; and You told

Your disciples to announce Your arising.

People: Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs

is the Kingdom of Heaven!

Reader: Upon seeing You, O Christ the Light, those who slept in darkness, in the

nethermost parts of Hades, were raised from the dead.

People: Blessed are you when people revile you, persecute you, and say all kinds

of evil against you falsely for my sake!

Reader: The zeal of Seth for His Creator is praised throughout the world, for in his

blameless life and spiritual love he was truly pleasing to God, and now he

cries out in the land of the living: Holy are you, O Lord!

People: Rejoice, and be exceedingly glad, for great is your reward in heaven!

Reader: The wondrous Enos trusted in the Spirit and with divine wisdom began to

call upon the God and Master of all with mouth, tongue and heart; and

having lived on Earth in a God-pleasing manner, he received glory.

People: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Reader: Let us praise Enoch with sacred voices, for having been well pleasing to

the Lord, he was translated in glory, being shown to be greater than death, as it has been written, since he had been a most earnest servant of God.

People: Now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Reader: Now the expectation of the nations comes forth from the Virgin, and

Bethlehem radiantly opens the shut gates of Eden, receiving the incarnate

Word, who in the flesh is laid in a manger.

You have put off the old self with his doings and you have put on the new self who is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of his Creator. Here, there cannot be Greek and Jew, circumcision and uncircumcision, barbarian, Scythian, slave or free; but Christ is all, and in all!
