The Hymn to the Theotokos

Instead of “It is truly right...” we chant the Irmos of the 9th Ode of the 1st Canon of the Feast.

Tone 1

People: Magnify, O my soul, her who is greater in honour and more glorious than the hosts on high, the All-pure Virgin Theotokos.

A strange and wonderful mystery do I see: the cave is Heaven; the Virgin is the throne of the Cherubim; the manger is the place in which Christ, the God whom nothing can contain, is laid. We praise and magnify Him.
